Scripture Meditation of the Week

Acts 16:25

But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

[Context: Paul and Silas were beaten and put in stocks in a dank dungeon after freeing a slave girl, used as a fortune-teller, from the bonds of demonic possession].

Whistling in the dark? Power of positive thinking? A comforting naivety that 'everything will work out ok'? How absurd can one be that they will praise God in the midst of such brutal circumstances? A zealot may try to face it down stoically, or with fierce opposition, but not with praise to God unless done for the sake of defiance.

These were men so filled with the Holy Spirit that they looked upon this punishment for doing the right thing as a privilege to do the work of God, in spite of the personal impact.

How might we approach the work of God? Do we have a limit of 'doing good' or 'doing God's work' that is a step too far leaving us uncomfortable or fearing loss?

Paul and Silas were strapped into a cell but their hearts escaped the tyranny of men as it soared into the very throne room of God. And with this available to us, we still limit ourselves to what we are willing to do.
